HOW TO USE THIS CAREERS INFORMATION

These Manufacturing Careers InfoSheets are designed for school-leavers and anyone else who is interested in gaining information on the many opportunities available in the manufacturing industry.

easy to use

The InfoSheets are easy to use. The first eighteen InfoSheets provide general information on the Manufacturing Industry as a whole, gaining employment, general tips and required qualifications. Each of the remaining InfoSheets cover one industry 'sector' and contain a sector introduction page and between five and ten job pages from within that sector.

For those familiar with the zoom products, you will find that the structure is consistent with the structure used to represent the industry in zoom+.

To make the most of these materials we suggest the following approach:

- using the contents page, print the individual InfoSheets in the first section that you feel are of value;
- then select sectors of interest and print either the whole sector, or the first (sector intro) page and any of the job pages within the sector that are of interest to you.

printing the InfoSheets

These InfoSheets are screen viewable, but are designed primarily to be printed on A4 paper. They have a 10mm white border and so will print perfectly on printers that do not print to the edge of the paper, e.g. most lasers.

These InfoSheets are 'print ready' for commercial printing in larger numbers (either offset or digital print). They are colour coded for ease of collation when large numbers of the InfoSheets have been printed.

a note to brokers

These InfoSheets may be duplicated and distributed freely for the purposes of education, however they are not to be resold.

The file sizes have been kept small enough for web-based distribution.

We hope you find these InfoSheets useful and encourage you to distribute them as widely as you wish.
